### **President's Message**

Somehow she saw our July newsletter where I shared with you my 2021 resolution and my reason for having agreed to serve as AAUW-ODC President in 2021-2022. She sent the following message:

Michael Goldhaber is a 79-year-old former theoretical physicist, who as early as the mid-1980's, made the following predictions:

- The complete dominance of the internet;
- Increased shamelessness in politics;
  - Terrorists co-opting social media;
- The rise of reality TV, personal websites, oversharing, and online influencer culture;
  - The near destruction of our ability to focus.

Mr. Goldhaber's epiphany was this: One of the most finite resources in the world is human attention. He said he couldn't shake the idea that this "attention economy" would lead to deepening inequality. He said, *"I kept thinking that human attention is highly desirable and that those who want it tend to want as much as they can possibly get. When you have attention, you have power, and some people will try and succeed in getting huge amounts of attention, and they would not use it in equal or positive ways."* 

What a thrill it was for me to learn on the eve of 2022 that the "Cassandra of the internet" is married to an AAUW member. The irony that it's because of the internet that his wife found my July article isn't lost on me, but what a connection AAUW membership brings. I am humbled by and grateful for the bond we share.

Where we choose to focus our attention and our resources of time and money demonstrates what we value. I appreciate the opportunity this organization provides me to allocate the attention and resources I have in more focused, intentional ways. Please join me in showing up on Zoom for book club and our programs in February and March and on at least 1 or more special in-person, Covid-safe outings this Spring. It's really the only

requirement to keeping one's resolve to pay attention to where you pay attention. Together, we can help balance the scales for women in diversity, equity and inclusion.
