An organized partisan effort in a designated nonpartisan race has more to do with hardcore political opportunity than it does with the campaign slogan: "Better Board, Better Schools."

"An enslaved woman tried to set fire to one of the property's homes. It was filled with members of the Cameron family. She laid the fire starter on an oak board, hoping for a quick blaze." (Source: diaries and oral histories)

White plantation owners documented their history and dominated the narrative of slavery in America through letters and land deeds. 

Accordingly, they sought a physical education instructor for the women students and asked the architect to plan a basement room for physical exercise in new Women's Building.
